

Youth Empowerment Coordinator

The youth empowerment coordinator is responsible for providing youth-led and primary prevention programs to schools, civic organizations, religious groups and others on the topic of relational aggression, violence prevention, family, relationship and sexual violence. This individual will assist in developing and delivering all violence prevention and leadership programs and the work of the Sexual Assault Services Team (staff & volunteers). Position will be 40 hours per week with competitive salary and benefits. The schedule will vary on school and programmatic demands. Bachelor degree in education, social services, or related field required with at least one year of experience. Youth Empowerment Coordinator reports to and will be supervised by Violence Prevention Program Manager.

REQUIREMENTS

- + Undergraduate degree in education, social work, social services, or related field required.
- + 1 year of classroom or group facilitation experience in field of sexual violence prevention or youth-led prevention.
- + Knowledge of principles, research, and best practices as they relate to primary and youth-led prevention.
- + Cultural humility and the ability to work sensitively and inclusively with diverse groups and students.
- + Strong interpersonal and public speaking skills; knowledge of gender studies, family and intimate partner violence, sexual violence and child abuse a plus.
- + Successful candidate must pass a Motor Vehicles Report and BCI background check.
- + Strong software proficiency.

PREFERRED

- + Preferred candidate would have 3 to 5 years of youth led group facilitation and classroom experience.
- + Ideal candidate would have strong evaluation and data collection experience for multiple program reports.
